It is a non-profit voluntary; Society has been registered under the Societies registration Act XXI of 1860. The organization has also been issued with the 010190048 as its FCRA number.

A Unit of JMJSSS was established as JMJ Community Care Centre(JMJCCC) functioning under the umbrella of JMJ Convent from the year 2009 at Baraipali, Sambalpur District of Odisha.

As HIV/AIDS is a sensitive issue. It renders the people infected and affected in a position of high vulnerability not only on terms of the physical, but also afflicts the mind and spirit. The Community Care Centre (CCC) is supported by JMJ General Hospital and is providing comprehensive care and support services in the form of counseling, outreach services, follow-up and to PLHIV as per the national guidelines for CCC- Operational Guidelines for Community Care Centers. The concept of institutionalized care of PLHIV has been emerging as the epidemic has shown its impact on the lives of the people. Hence, we have reached out to 234 clients from 12 districts of odisha.
