INCEPTION

The JMJ Social Service Society(JMJSSS) was established in Nallapadu, Guntur District of Andhra Pradesh in the year 1982.

It is a non-profit voluntary; Society has been registered under the Societies registration Act XXI of 1860. The organization has also been issued with the 010190048 as its FCRA number.

A Unit of JMJSSS was established as JMJ Community Care Centre(JMJCCC) functioning under the umbrella of JMJ Convent from the year 2009 at Baraipali, Sambalpur District of Odisha.

To improve health status of the poor by promoting community health.

To build up the capacity of the people for sustainable livelihood.

COMMUNITY CARE CENTRE FOR PEOPLE LIVING WITH HIV/AIDS:



HIV/AIDS is a sensitive issue. It renders the people infected with the virus and the patients are affected not only in terms of physical ailments but the deadly sickness has an impact on the mind and the spirit. The community Care Centre (CCC) is supported by JMJ General Hospital and the hospital is providing comprehensive care and the support services in the form of counseling, outreach services, follow-up and PLHIV as per the national guidelines for CCC- Operational Guidelines for Community Care Centers. The concept of institutionalized care of PLHIV has been emerging in fast paced manner because of the epidemic proportion it has developed. Hence, we have reached out to 504 clients from 12 districts of Odisha.

Supervision of ICTC Counselors, Xavier Institute of Management, Bhubaneswar:

In collaboration with Xavier Institute of Management (XIMB), supervision of ICTC Counselors was taken up by JMJ Community Care Centre (JMJCCC) in the month of June 2011 for the counselors of the 3 ICTCs, Burla. We realize the need for the counseling supervision and we feel that it should be better defined and understood especially the strain and stress of HIV counseling. The workloads and periodic visits to ICTCs are carried out to monitor the functioning of ICTC counselors.

Christian AIDS/HIV National Alliance (CANA), Delhi, India:

JMJ CCC initiated this UMANG program in collaboration with CANA, New Delhi to express their love, care and concern towards the HIV infected children. The AIDS orphans in our communities require urgent support and care. Our participation would ensure support for each child and will also save it from eternal destruction. Therefore, JMJCCC is organizing the UMANG program on the 15th of every month for 20 children out of 45 children registered in the centre. Thus, we provide them Nutritional, psychological and other basic support is provided for the days to come.

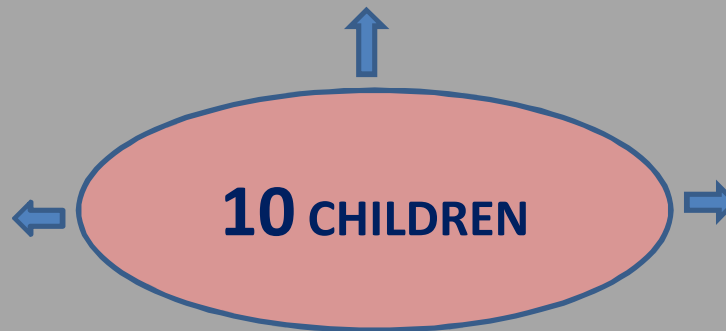
